This is another important update relative to our research efforts in the context of our research efforts in exploring the underlying causes behind the macro trends in deaths, disabilities, and injuries that we have been observing from early 2021 onwards.

We are releasing research on Cardiovascular deaths and disabilities in England and Wales for young individuals aged 15 to 44. Our research provides strong evidence showing the increased trend in Cardiovascular deaths, which rose by substantial amounts in 2021 and 2022. Our results are highly statistically significant and corroborate the anecdotes we observe on sudden deaths in the population.

Additionally, we also released some of our projects for external funding. This will help us expand our infrastructure, including our webservers.
